Construction Relief is Near!

Hang in there Muirfield; the City is almost to goal on two major projects that have littered the landscape with orange barrels and slow trucks.

Both directions of Muirfield drive are getting five feet of extra pavement added to the outside lanes, and those will be given special marking designating them as bike lanes, making it safer for cyclists, drivers, and joggers. Plus the new LED streetlights, farther back from traffic, won't be jumping out in front of cars like they used to. If the two bridges just north of Brand Rd. have not yet been installed, keep your eyes open for the crane that will move those into place. They will be longer than but identical in look to the bridge on the Brand Rd. bike path. This project should make it safer during Tournament week also, as fans have often walked very close to moving vehicles as they walked home or to their own cars after play. The project should complete in mid-November, but final landscaping will not be done until spring. It was originally scheduled for 2013, but was delayed once the Muirfield Village Golf Club succeeded in getting the prestigious President's Cup.

The Glick/Dublin Rd. intersection is also nearly finished. We will finally have left turn lanes, denying Shawnee Hills CONTINUED ON PAGE 5

PROFILE BOB FATHMAN: THE MAYOR OF MUIRFIELD

Some Muirfield residents call him "The Mayor of Muirfield." His patients call him "Dr. Bob." His five grandkids call him "Papa." His wife, Gina, calls him to take out the garbage, spread mulch and help with other chores at their lovely home on a Muirfield pond. Most of you reading this know **Bob Fathman** as the guy who sends out the e-mail blasts to MVCA members updating us on road closures, development proposals coming before City Council and much more. Bob sends those as Chair of the MVCA's Civic Action Committee (CAC). But that is only the more visible and recurrent of his many involvements that better our community.

Bob and the CAC filed complaints with the Ohio Public Utilities Commission several years ago that resulted in

American Electric Power spending over \$14 million to improve the underground electricity system in Muirfield, including replacing an entire substation on Sawmill Rd. Muirfield had been averaging 3 outages a month, now these are rare. A couple of years ago he organized the leadership of all the subdivisions along Brand Rd., and hundreds of Muirfield residents, to lobby City Council to construct the recently completed multi-use path on Brand. Without his intervention, the path would have detoured around Wyandotte elementary and down Earlington, due to objections by one homeowner on Brand. He has now organized 8 other subdivision leaders into advocating for no or low-density development of the Riviera Golf Club, to avoid overloading schools and increasing





taxes. In addition to his role with the MVCA, Bob has been elected to the Muirfield Association Board where he is now serving this third term.

He and Gina do many behind the scene things in Muirfield as well, such as helping stuff thousands of plastic Easter eggs with candy for the MVCA's annual Easter egg hunt, and he has done highly visible things, like appearing on the Today Show, Anderson Cooper 360 (twice), CNN Headline News and even the Jerry Springer Show – in the days before chair throwing! The many media appearances, and testifying before Congress and to various state legislatures around the country, came about after he founded state and national organizations to end school corporal punishment. 31 states and all Catholic schools in the U.S. now prohibit teachers from paddling or otherwise hitting children. His profession, he is a clinical psychologist on the medical staff at Riverside and in private practice, lends professional credentials to his presentations on the subject.

For recreation, Bob enjoys biking around Dublin and Central Ohio, sometimes with a grandchild in the baby seat behind him. He and Gina travel extensively. Just this summer they toured Eastern Europe, Budapest to Bucharest, visited daughters and family in Atlanta and at Lake Tahoe, and spent a long weekend at Mammoth Cave, hiking extensively both underground and on the surface. They also relax by socializing with neighbors and friends, and just this summer hosted the summer TGIF party for all MVCA members at their home.

"Dr.," "Papa," "Mayor," "Dad," -- he is just "Bob" to all of us who know him. And we all benefit by having a person of such impact volunteer so much of his talent and time for our good here in Muirfield.



PROFILE SEEMA AND ANDREW CAMERON

If you've ever gone to the OhioHealth Dublin Urgent Care for strep throat, a broken arm, or had a sinus infection, you may have been treated by OhioHealth Urgent Care physician and local Muirfield resident, **Seema C. Cameron, MD**. Dr. Cameron and her husband, **Andrew Cameron, Ph.D.**, and their daughter, Keira, have called Muirfield home for the past four years. Keira is in second grade at Columbus Academy.

The Cameron's had rented a home in Powell during her residency. Once she decided to stay with OhioHealth after residency, the Cameron's wanted to find a permanent home in the Columbus area. They chose Muirfield because of its reputation for being family-oriented and a close-knit, involved community. They were also attracted to the neighborhood's aesthetics, architectural features of the houses, and numerous amenities, such as the miles of walking trails that they use with their two Bernese Mountain Dogs. There is also the added convenience of living only three miles from her OhioHealth Dublin Urgent Care workplace.

There is no "typical" day for Dr. Cameron at the Urgent Care. From cuts to ear aches, Dr. Cameron and her staff have to be prepared for anything. the revenue generated by ticketing drivers who went around left-turning cars on the right berm. Yay! We will soon have safer pedestrian crossings with crosswalks and push-button signals, and less of a wait for drivers. It will not be ideal - a roundabout would have been the best answer, but prior construction allowed by Shawnee Hills negated that possibility. The construction will bring us a long-awaited improvement, one which took great leadership from Dublin, which only has responsibility for a quarter of the intersection. Applause goes to City Engineer, Paul Hammersmith, who has long and effectively worked to make this possible.

Update on I-270/Rt. 33 Construction

As construction ends on Muirfield Drive and Glick/Dublin Road, a huge project "ramps" up at I-270 and US 33. The weave ramps that present such a hazard and slowdown will be removed, with directional ramps installed, and US 33 becoming four lanes in each direction between Avery-Muirfield and I-270. A new traffic signal will be installed where northbound 270 traffic exits onto eastbound 33. Tree removal begins in December, with actual construction starting spring of 2015. The largest impact begins June 8, when the two bridges that take Rt. 33 over I-270 will both be removed, as will be the ramp from 33 eastbound to 270 South. This will clog local streets as drivers are directed on detour routes. That major impact will last four months, until mid-October. Patience will be required when traveling thru this area as this important project begins. Many of you as individuals and business owners or executives sent in excellent letters of support for the funding of this project over the past year, and helped to finally make this happen. Details will come in later newsletters. Watch the Dublin website and local media for updates.

Busy as Bee's

The Muirfield Village Garden Club and the Dublin Girl Scout Troop 2573 celebrated National Pollinator week at the Dublin Library June 16-22. "Busy as bees," the scouts planted butterfly nectar plants. They also created hand drawn pictures for a library display to educate the public about the importance of saving the butterflies and bees. Because pollinators are threatened and are essential for the production of our food, the Muirfield Village Garden Club has dedicated some programs this year on this topic and has taken steps in the community to address this problem. We encourage Muirfield residents to recognize the value of adding pollinator plants to their landscapes. Some recommendations are milkweed (the only host plant for Monarch butterfly eggs), Shasta Daisies, Cosmos, Bee Balm, Phlox, Petunias, Zinnias, Lantana, Butterfly Weed and Sedum. These are plants that provide nectar for many butterfly species. Herbs like Fennel, Parsley, Mint, Sage and Rosemary are also valuable for the caterpillars. Remember our fruits require pollination by bees. With out them we would have no apples, peaches etc. So please try to avoid killing bees with sprays!

Remember as you clean up our gardens this fall, leave the dead purple coneflowers and Shasta daisy seed heads on the plants through the winter. This will help to feed overwintering birds! Blue Star Memorial Program

The Muirfield Village Garden Club is proud to announce their participation in the National Garden Club's Blue Star Memorial Program.

The Blue Star became an icon in WWII and was seen on flags and banners in homes, churches and businesses for sons and daughters away at war. In 1945 the National Council of State Garden Clubs began the Blue Star Memorial program, placing large metal Blue Star Highway Markers along highways throughout



the United States. The Blue Star program was expanded to include Memorial Markers to be placed in community locations.

The Muirfield Village Garden Club will be placing a Blue Star Memorial Marker and Memorial Garden on the grounds of the Dublin Cemetery. This Memorial Marker will be visible as you walk along Bridge Street and as your enter the Cemetery. A community dedication ceremony will be held when the Memorial Marker is placed.

Muirfield Resident and Garden Club Member, **Helen Houpt** has graciously assumed the chair position for this valuable community project.
