BLACK AND TAN GOES SCARLET & GRAY

The Muirfield Village Civic Association (MVCA) will host the 8th annual Black and Tan Fundraising Event - a Tailgate Party on Saturday, October 3rd, 2015. This year the event will held at the Bogey Inn on Glick Road and will feature OSU vs Indiana, food, drink and games as well as a silent auction. All proceeds from this year's event will benefit the Dublin Miracle Playground – Special Olympics Training Ground development.

Dublin's Darree Fields will be the location of the Special Olympics Training Ground at Miracle League Playground. The vision is for a universally accessible playground expansion providing space for Special Olympics athletes who have excelled beyond the current facilities. Using the training ground to build experience and strength, these athletes will in-turn inspire other athletes to participate in the Special Olympics.

Plans call for the training ground to be built adjacent to the existing Miracle League playground and field. Fitness stations and

training pad, laid out in accordance with the Special Olympics Train Program Guide, will be designed with special needs athletes in mind. Equipment and training pad will be wheelchair accessible and designed to inspire all athletes.

The MVCA launched the Black & Tan in 2008 to bring the community together for a fun event benefitting a Dublin based cause. Through the generosity of local businesses and community members, the Black & Tan has raised more than \$130,000 for the Dublin Food Pantry, Welcome Warehouse and The Miracle Diamond.

ENHANCE THE VISUALS OF YOUR HOME

Besides the often-discussed improvements like replacing or seriously trimming overgrown landscaping, applying a new coat of paint, trimming up lower tree branches or replacing a worn front door, these photos show a couple of ways to add to the visual impression of your Muirfield home. Our mailboxes have a small shelf in the back, a perfect spot to anchor a potted, flowering plant. The space is large enough for a good sized planter. You may want to tie a wire around it to prevent wind or the weight of growing stems from toppling it. Though it likely will need daily watering, it adds great pop to your curb appeal, for a next-to-nothing cost.



The trampoline set into the ground requires more cost, and needs a sloping rear yard so that water can gravity-drain to a stream, pond or drainage system. This one has treated landscape timbers holding back the earth, with a drain pipe to the pond. There is a plastic sheet coving the dirt to collect water

and direct it to the drain, then a layer of gravel for appearance. As a huge advantage, no safety net is needed, toddlers can easily get on and off and the whole thing greatly improves the view for you and your neighbors. November 2015 Ballot: Council, School Board, and Tax Issues

Even if you are ignoring the multi-candidate race for the presidency [really? can one ignore that?] aimed at 2016 elections, we have important issues coming up this November right here in Dublin.

The Dublin School Board has two incumbents running for re-election. Muirfield resident Scott Melody and fellow Board Member Chris Valentine are unopposed, so that race doesn't need discussion.

But there are six candidates running for three seats on Dublin City Council, including two incumbents and four challengers. Up for re-election are Mayor Mike Keenan and Vice Mayor Rick Gerber. Long-time Councilwoman and former Mayor [and resident of Muirfield] Marilee Chinnici-Zuercher is retiring. Running also for those seats are: Kevin Cooper, Kevin Walter, and Muirfield residents Christina Alutto and Christine Groomes.

Franklin County Muirfield residents have a tax levy to support the Zoo and another for the Alcohol, Drug Abuse and Mental Health Board. All Muirfield residents will vote on a Washington Township Fire levy.

The MVCA Civic Action Committee will ask each Council candidate to respond to an ini-

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN MUIRFIELD HOME SALES?

Columbus home sale prices and time-to-sell are setting all-time records. Year to date the number of homes sold in Columbus was up 9.7 % compared with the same period last year. This is the highest on record for the first seven months of any year.

But more specifically... what about Muirfield? It's been an interesting year. Our sales prices in the last 12 months averaged \$441,936 which is 6.2% higher than the previous 12 month average of \$416,053. This average is an "all time high" for Muirfield! Of interest is that our most recent 12 month sales history has been somewhat price specific. Of our 106 homes sold, 87 were priced below \$500,000 while just 19 were priced above this number.

What we are finding is that our larger, higher priced Muirfield homes are in competition with new construction that is taking place in the Dublin area. Muirfield is not the only community being challenged by these newly built homes; Tartan Fields is experiencing the same challenge. As of 8/24/15 there were 26 homes on the market priced below \$500,000. This is enough inventory to last only about 1.5 months. Interestingly, there were also 26 homes for sale priced above \$500,000. Based on our current rate of sales in this higher price range, this is enough inventory to last 16 months.

What does this all mean for a seller today? If you are in the lower price range, have properly prepared your house for the market, and are priced appropriately you will sell in a relatively short timeframe. If you are one of our more expensive Muirfield homes you may have more preparation to do if you want to maximize your financial reward. You have to look like, and be staged like, a model home in order to compete and sell at the higher price. Buyers are ready and waiting for homes to be listed for sale. So when a properly presented, well-staged home that is priced correctly comes on the market -- it will sell.

GARDEN CLUB DEDICATES BLUE STAR MEMORIAL GARDEN



The Muirfield Village Garden Club dedicated the Blue Star Memorial Marker Garden on Flag Day June 14, 2015. This project was initiated over two years ago and the Club would like to extend its appreciation to everyone involved.

The Project would not have been as successful without approval and support of the City of Dublin and the Dublin City Council. The Parks and Recreation department helped with the selection of the sight, turned the grass, and recycled stone from Dublin construction sites into a stone wall. The Dublin Events Administration provided all necessary information, audio visual equipment, podium, chairs and flags.

The Garden Club would like to sincerely thank the Dublin Foundation for the generous grant for the project. Thanks also to the Dublin Community Church, LaChatelaine Restaurant, The Andersons store, all private donors, and the National Garden Club and the Garden Club of Ohio for their guidance. Special recognition also goes to the "muscle" supplied by many Club members and husbands on planting day.

Flag Day was a beautiful sunny, hot and windy day. Fortunately, guests attending the dedication sat under shade trees while the Dublin Community Band played patriotic songs, including the theme songs from each branch of the armed forces. The program began with the Presentation of Colors by Dublin VFW Post 10691 and Dublin American Legion Post 800. Sgt. Alex Rozanski of the Ohio Army National Guard led the pledge of allegiance, soloist Brigid Ogden sang the National Anthem, and Chaplain Nick Chou gave the invocation.

Highlights of the program included the Blue Star Memorial Marker history (this is the 70th year) presented by the National Garden Club Blue Star Memorial Chairperson, Andrea Little from Massachusetts. Muirfield Garden Club Secretary and Blue Star Memorial Chair Helen Houpt unveiled the beautiful marker honoring all of our armed forces members. She was assisted by Garden Club of Ohio Columbus District Chair Karen Ciula, and by Muirfield Village Garden Club board members Barbara Hilyard, (President), Madeleine Breitmayer (Vice President), and Pam Ellinger (Treasurer).



Barbara, also representing the Garden Club of Ohio as the Southern District Blue Star Chairman, led the dedication and presented the Memorial Marker and Garden to the City of Dublin. Mayor Michael H. Keenan accepted on behalf of the city and was also given a National Garden Club Blue Star Pin. The Mayor addressed the attendees and invited Club members to surround the garden as he expressed thanks for their work and dedication. Chaplain Chou then gave the Benediction and Brigid Ogden led the guests in singing God Bless America. A reception followed the ceremony in the Dublin Community Church with refreshments generously donated by LaChatelaine Restaurant.

The Garden Club invites MVCA residents to visit the Blue Star Memorial Marker. Visit with your children and grandchildren. Discuss history! The patriotic-themed Blue Star Memorial Garden will be blooming until the frost. Look for butterflies and bees nestling among the red dwarf roses, red and white geraniums, and blue lobelia flowers. Most importantly, as you pass the historic Dublin cemetery on RT 161, and notice the impressive Blue Star Memorial Marker, please pause and remember all of our armed forces members, past, present and future. Our freedom depends on them!

REQUEST FOR DUBLIN CITY SERVICES

Do you have large tree limbs that need curbside chipper service or have an issue that you feel needs attention by the city -- like those wide cracks in the street that need to be filled and tarred? While many Muirfield residents call the Muirfield Association office or e-mail CAC Chair Bob Fathman to seek resolution, the City of Dublin makes it easy for residents to request services by just using a single point of entry on the city website. Go to http://dublinohiousa.gov/service-request/

A city employee will review the request and forward it to the appropriate department for action, usually by the next business day. You will be called to let you know that the request has been forwarded and that the particular department may call you as a follow-up. You can still just make a phone call as well. The link provided above has the service request link and the phone numbers for the common departments residents would deal with for services, as well as a 24-hour hot line. The webpage is full of links to other information about the various services provided by the City of Dublin for residents. We live in a great city!

tial series of questions, and subsequent follow-up questions, relevant to Muirfield voters. All residents who are MVCA members will receive from the CAC detailed information about candidates, positions, and tax consequences. This in-depth report will be e-mailed to those of you who have already been receiving e-mails from the CAC. Other residents can find this information on the MVCA website.

But first things first: be sure you are registered, that anyone in your household who will turn 18 by November 3rd is also registered, and that your registration is up to date with any recent move you have made.

Delaware County residents can check their registration status,

or register, by going to this website: http://www.co.delaware.oh.us/boe/index.html. Franklin County residents can do the same via: http://vote.franklincountyohio.gov/.

And today it is simple to vote by mail. You do not have to be absent to vote "absentee." Delaware county residents can use the same site above to print, for each voter, and mail a request for an absentee ballot, and you can do that today. Franklin county residents can use http://vote.franklincountyohio.gov/absentee/. After mailing in your request, you will receive a ballot in early October.

Let's vote, Muirfield! Show our strength in the turnout and our local politicians will be more responsive to our concerns.
