KidSMILES An affordable option for kids in need

Muirfield residents Jim and Julie Homon are on a mission to provide low-income families with affordable dentistry. As an orthodontist with practices in Powell and Delaware, Dr. Homon saw a critical shortage of affordable dental options in central Ohio and wanted to provide an alternative.

"My colleagues and I were getting more calls asking for us to help on pro bono cases—many of them from Dublin school nurses. Coupled with the startling statistic that 14% of children in Franklin and Delaware Counties have never visited a dentist, I knew we had to find a way to create a solution," says Dr. Homon.

KidSMILES was founded in 2008 by Dr. Homon to fill a void in central Ohio. High costs and long wait times are factors in children not receiving the preventative care they need. KidSMILES aims to serve these children utilizing a unique, low-cost model with

THE BUNKER: Muirfield's Premier Summer Event

Memorial Week is a fun time for Columbus residents and golf fans everywhere, but it is something far more special to us in Muirfield Village. The Memorial Tournament is a yearly reminder of how great it is to be a part of the Muirfield community.

Last year, The Country Club at Muirfield Village (TCCMV) undertook a brand new venture called The Bunker. Muirfield Village resident and TCCMV Member **John Warner** summed it up best: "Let's make it the biggest and best party of Memorial Week!" The Bunker began as an idea by **Kirk Smith**, another Muirfield resident and TCCMV member, to bring the idea of The Phoenix Open's "Birds Nest" to The Memorial Tournament. The vision was to become the premier entertainment venue of Memorial Week, and to provide an experience in keeping with Muirfield Village's status as the greatest community in the Columbus area.

After a few short months, The Bunker had gone from being nothing but an idea, to a full-scale concert venue! Thanks to the effort of former TCCMV General Manager Michael Graney, and John Warner, the event was a hit! Over 2,000 passes were sold in the first year, and the main objective was accomplished. In addition, TCCMV was also proud to provide support through the Bunker to the TCCMV Foundation, which benefits children with special needs.

With a successful first year under their belt, the TCCMV has proudly announced that it will once again be hosting the Bunker with three nights of live entertainment, food, drinks, and the company of your fellow Muirfield residents. volunteer dentists, hygienists and dental assistants staffing the clinic. They currently have more than 250 volunteers signed up to help. Each visit will only cost \$10.

Since receiving its non-profit status in June 2010, KidSMILES has been raising money for the clinic. Several local organizations have shown support by providing grant money to outreach efforts and the clinic. KidSMILES has received grants from The Dublin Foundation (\$6,000), Dublin Women's Club (\$1,015) and Wendy's (\$10,000).

The organization is focusing on raising funds in a variety of ways including a 5K-event set for June 23rd at Glacier Ridge

Metro Park. The Homons and the KidSMILES board members are determined to succeed.

"I feel passionately about this subject," says **Julie Homon**, who accepted the board's invitation to serve as the group's Executive Director in 2010. "There are many barriers to good dental care. Our clinic will be an option that will provide care for existing issues like cavities but more importantly, we will focus on preventative care.

Principles of Landscaping

Landscapes are often thought of as just plants. But hardscaping elements--walls, terraces, walkways, decks, cooking areas, and water features--will transform the beauty of your landscape into a wonderful extension of your home.

Most professional designers, after years of practice, will apply these principles automatically. The following is a list of a few basics that can help you as you turn your home into an oasis:

UNITY: This is probably the most important area for the overall plan. A good plan will have unity in all things. Look for all parts to interrelate with each other and also relate to the overall plan.

SCALE AND PROPORTION: Keep all individual elements in proportion with the rest of your garden and in scale as it relates to the structures, property, and the human elements.

BALANCE: This area is very important as it could throw off the entire plan. It is how you relate visually to the various relationships between the landscape elements. If you're not careful you will create unbalanced and restless areas. Symmetry is an equal balance where both sides of the view are the same. Asymmetry is an unequal balance where both sides of the view are different although weighted the same. If your eye is attracted equally to both sides of the view although different, you have balance.

FOCAL AREAS: Select various plants or structural elements to accent a given area. An example would be the front of the house where the entry or front door would be your focal area. The entire plantings or hardscape material placement should be done so you are attracted to the front door. Care however, must be used as it is easy to create too many focal areas.

RHYTHM AND LINE: Consider blending with harmony one element or area to another in a smooth fashion. All things should interrelate with each other and provide an uninterrupted connection within your plan. This can be done using gradual changes involving variety, textures, colors, form and sizes. Here the challenge is to keep the eye moving smoothly in rhythm from one area to another.


The important thing is to keep the concept the same and provide unity in all phases. But most of all, remember to have fun exploring the world of gardening.


