GENERAL INTEREST: IN AND AROUND THE VILLAGE CAFÉ, COFFEE SHOP, ICE CREAM PARLOR AT MUIRFIELD SQUARE?

You know Muirfield Square, right? The office area at the southwest corner of Muirfield and Memorial Drive where there is a veterinarian hospital, pediatrician office, an eye doctor and other offices. Now picture it with a small Italian restaurant with a bar, wood-fired pizzas, outdoor tables in the central plaza and a real chef. Add an ice cream parlor, a dry cleaner, a small Carfagna's grocery store, maybe a florist and a travel agency. A real "Village Center!"

All of that existed in 1991. Girardi's restaurant was a hit. The small ice cream parlor also rented VHS movies. You could drop off your dry cleaning, pick up flowers and a movie, and pick up a to-go dinner all in one stop. What happened? The businesses were actually doing very well and wanted to stay, but they were forced out when the landlord did not renew their leases. His wife wanted the restaurant space to use for a catering business, and he wanted the remaining spaces for his expanding business. That business became National Century Financial Enterprises, a collection agency for hospitals and other health care agencies. It closed years later when 23 F.B.I. agents raided it and its top officers were all convicted of a \$3 billion fraud.

Today, two of the nine "pods" are for sale, and another has space available for sale or lease. The Muirfield Homeowners Association is on record in support neighborhood-friendly retail in that location. This article is written in hopes that a reader or acquaintance might have an interest in exploring a business like those mentioned. Wouldn't it be great to have our own little stop-and-shop sort of place to hang with our neighbor friends? It is up to all of us to talk it up and make it happen.

Muirfield: Remember to Vote November 5th

Here is the local election in brief: The incumbents on the Dublin School Board have no opponents, but the race for City Council is overflowing. All four Dublin City Council positions up this year have opponents vying for votes. That is rare. Four years ago, no incumbent had a challenger. Please keep City Council responsive to the needs of Muirfield residents by turning out in large numbers to vote.

Most of Muirfield is in Dublin Ward 3, where Kevin Walter, of the Belvedere subdivision, challenging incumbent is Councilman John Reiner, a Muirfield resident. A small area of Muirfield off Memorial Drive near Dublin Rd. falls in Ward 1, where incumbent Cathy Boring has retired. Four challengers are asking for your vote: Christine Gawronski, Julie Hubler. Gregory Peterson and Alexander Schaffer are all in the race. None are Muirfield residents.

While we can't vote for the candidates in the other two wards, we have friends and family in those areas. We will have asked each of these candidates a few questions of interest to Muirfield residents. and will post that information on the MVCA website. SQUIRRELS IN THE ATTIC? GROUNDHOGS OR SKUNKS UNDER YOUR DECK? DON'T KILL THEM... JUST TELL THEM TO SCRAM!

It's the time of the year when wild animals are seeking winter shelter. Ohio's animals are adept at finding any structural weakness in or around your home that will lead them to a warm, safe spot to hide out for the winter. Bring in Ohio's ONLY 100% non-lethal wild animal control service to solve your existing problem OR to ensure that you won't have wild tenants this winter!

SCRAM! Wildlife Control is the social enterprise created by Ohio Wildlife Center, a local 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that offers a hospital for injured and orphaned wild animals as well as a 20-acre nature education center. All fees generated by SCRAM! directly support Ohio Wildlife Center's mission in our community.

Recently, the most common calls received from Muirfield residents are regarding squirrels, skunks and groundhogs. Squirrels are attracted to easy food sources, and with their small size, they can take advantage of even the smallest compromises in fascia, soffits and gable vents. Many squirrels have offspring twice a year, so the population can grow quickly. They can also cause damage to wiring in an attic space.

Skunks are attracted by a consistent food source, including bird feeders,



fishponds and grubs in your lawn. They like to travel close to walls, so cover any window wells or place a plank at an angle in the well so animals can escape on their own.

As with squirrels and skunks (there's a trend!), groundhogs will be attracted by a reliable food source, but they'll stay on the ground rather than in your attic! They are most likely be found under garages, sheds and decks or via a hole next to your foundation or near patio pavers that have nice, loose soil to dig in. They are Ohio's only true hibernator, and will establish their hibernating site in the fall, so they need to be evicted sooner rather than later.

They may not have the years of know-how behind them, but it didn't take much for two local Muirfield kids to figure out how to make a difference to others! Muirfield resident's **Reagan Snyder** and **Nick Butler** were busy this past spring carrying out a toy drive in their neighborhood to help the families at the Columbus YMCA Family Shelter.

After learning about the Shelter from her Girl Scout Troop, Reagan came up with the idea to collect toys for the boys and girls who live there. While talking about it on her bus ride to school one day, Nick asked if he could help, too. Reagan approached her mother, **Laura Snyder**, and said she would like go door to door to ask friends and neighbors to donate new and gently used toys. Reagan typed up a letter and delivered it to the homes on Crossgate Court North and South and was thrilled when a number of neighbors generously donated. Together, Reagan and Nick collected the toys using two wagons and a little bit of leg power. Reagan said, "It was really fun collecting all the toys and realizing how kind all of her neighbors were." Once the toys were collected, Laura helped organize and deliver them to the downtown Shelter. Reagan said, "It made me so happy to see the little kids receive all sorts of new toys to play with. And the little bit of effort was worth it to see the kid's smiles!"

The goodwill did not end with the toy drive. In lieu of birthday gifts, Reagan asked her friends to bring non-perishable food items to her 11th birthday party. The food collected went directly to the Dublin Food Pantry. Reagan's sister, **Madison Snyder**, followed her example and asked her friends to donate gently used children's books in lieu of presents at her birthday party.

Both Reagan and Nick have proved a simple idea and a little effort can make a big difference in the lives of other people.

RESIDENT PROFILE ANNE AND JACK PARTRIDGE

There are some amazing residents of Muirfield Village who have stellar reputations! Meet one couple that dedicates a huge amount of time and exceptional talent to bettering our community!

As a kid, did you ever ring doorbells trying to sell candy for a sports team or cookies for girl scouts? As an adult, did you ever ask friends to donate to a charity? **Anne and Jack Partridge**, Muirfield residents of 24 years, are aiming to raise at least \$51 million dollars this year as co-chairs of the United Way (UW) campaign! Concerned that the Columbus area "topped" the poverty list among 15 similar metro areas including Cleveland and Cincinnati, this dynamic duo took a look at the need and are organizing the massive effort to stem the growing gulf that is pushing more people into substandard living. And don't think "handouts" when you think of UW and its agencies. The goal is not to hand out fish, but to teach fishing. Education, health, and getting people into jobs and creating safe living and learning areas are the foci.

Their effort with the UW is only a small part of what they do as volunteers. Anne also chairs the development committee of the Ronald McDonald House Charities Board. She has been in leadership roles of the Heinzerling Foundation, the Muirfield Village Civic Association, St. Brigid and Bishop Watterson Schools, KidSmiles Dental Clinic, the Furniture Bank of Central Ohio, and now she is helping start a Women's Auxiliary for St. Anne's/Mt. Carmel Hospital in order to combat the very high infant mortality rate in Central Ohio. Jack has a busy corporate life as president of Columbia Gas and also Chief Regulatory Officer of NiSource. He has also chaired the Columbus Chamber of Commerce Board, and is on the boards of Columbus 2020, the Columbus Partnership and the Ohio Business Roundtable. It exhausts one just to read this list, and the list continues with many more volunteer roles than could fit this space.

What is their time management secret? How does this couple



manage a life and all they giveback to the community? Well, they had four children all within 18 months! Yes, a daughter, and 18 months later, triplet daughters! No live-in help, and extended families that lived out of state. Anne laughs and says she changed 10,000 diapers. Jack laughs and talks about teaching three girls to drive all at the same time – and they all passed their driving test on the first try, a fact that causes him to beam with pride! The kids are all out of college, and all live locally at the moment. These early organizational skills, acquired out of necessity, surely helped them to become the do-it-all couple they are today.

Hudson Ozello is the type of kid you want on your team; he works hard, plays fair and always gives 110%. He is a friend to many and a leader to all. He has many interests and passions and works hard to share his spirit and altruistic characteristics to those around him!

Hudson is a Life Scout and is currently planning his Eagle Scout project. He has helped many fellow Scouts with their projects and anticipates spending 100 plus hours to accomplish this final Boy Scout Service.

At school, Hudson is currently the Vice President of Jerome Key Club (a Community Service Organization). 'Blessings in a Backpack' is the major service project of this organization where every other week, students from Coffman and/or Jerome travel to Chapman Elementary to fill kids backpacks with enough food to ensure they are fed over the weekend. This past summer Hudson organized a fundraiser for "Blessings" and broke the Guinness Book of World Records for the longest chain of Zip Ties. He organized 102 volunteers and in total they spent close to 2000 man-hours achieving their goal.

In addition to his work with the Jerome Key Club, 'on-line compliments' become the craze this past year at school. And, when Hudson and a friend learned that Coffman High School had started a 'compliments' website, they immediately developed a website for Jerome called Celtic Compliments. This website is open to all Jerome students to give compliments anonymously to each other. Hudson and his co-founder had to review each compliment and post to the Facebook page. Within one month, 1000 compliments were received.



This past summer was Hudson's 3rd summer volunteering 60 plus hours at the Columbus Zoo. In addition to his hours at the zoo, it was his 4th summer volunteering 40 hours on a mission Trip in Southern Ohio. Previously, he re-shingled a roof and built a wheel chair accessible ramp for a mobile home.

Hudson successfully balances a rigorous academic curriculum in the International Baccalaureate program while serving as a true leader and friend in many clubs and organizations. He is the type of kids who is working hard to become a leader within our community. Way to go Hudson! You are a great role model and inspiration to all! MUIRFIELD VILLAGE GARDEN CLUB ON THE PRAIRIE

Our August meeting took us to Fredericktown for a most interesting visit to Guy Denny's homemade prairie. He owns over 50 acres, 25 acres of woods and about 25 acres open farmland. Guy Denny started his prairie in the farmland acreage about 20 years ago, with his love and knowledge of the prairie plants and various species specific to the prairielands. His two man-made ponds also lend itself to a beautiful habitat for many beautiful water plants, birds and animals. We learned how he must do a total controlled burn every March to the entire prairie to keep other plants and trees from overtaking it. It then renews itself every spring, as the root systems of the prairie plants are about 1/3 deep into the ground. Every season brings a new look to the prairie, as it is an ever-changing area of beauty. Guy Denny's enthusiasm of the native prairie plants has rubbed off on us, and we look forward to visiting the native wildflowers in the spring.

Our year of activities continued in September learning about plant selection and care, and then October will find us at chair member **Gina Fathman's** home to learn about the fall planting of bulbs. In November, we will meet at the Dublin Library to create our own holiday arrangements. Creative Arrangers designer, Lynn Fronk, will teach the class. We end up the year with a guided tour of the Franklin Conservatory and lunch at Lindy's restaurant in Columbus.
