Residents Efforts Dramatically Re-shaped Riviera

In October 2012, alarm bells went off all over the northwest quadrant of Dublin when Business First carried an article that the Riviera Golf Club might soon become 500 homes. The developer was identified as Charlie Ruma.

Concerns about school overcrowding, tax increases, traffic, and loss of green space led MVCA Civic Action Committee Chair Bob Fathman to organize a "Riviera Concerns Group" (RCG) to explore options and potentially protect Muirfield residents from the impact of a mega-development just across Avery Road. RCG was quickly joined in brainstorming by the leadership of Belvedere, Tartan West, Savona Condominiums, Park Place, Post Preserve, Brandon, Celtic Estates, and the Friends of Dublin

First efforts of the group were aimed at keeping the Club in business, or at least "keeping Riviera green". There was hope to convince the City and/ or School Board to purchase the property for parkland and a nature study area, as was done by the New Albany Schools. The group contacted the Wetland Bank of Central Ohio and learned that eligible acreage converted to wetlands could

MUIRFIELD WAS HOME TO A CHURCH AND SCHOOL IN THE 1800'S

As mentioned in the article about the cemetery in the last newsletter, there used to be a church on the same plot of ground, just south of the cemetery. Built on Kinross Drive about where it intersects with Memorial Drive, it was known as "Mt. Zion United Brethren Church," or "The Old Myzine." According to Muirfield CAC Chair Bob Fathman, early historical documents had some residents being buried in that cemetery as early as 1760, so building a church next to the cemetery must have seemed a natural location. In 1846 local farmers hewed logs to construct the church, but then a saw mill opened. Logs were hauled there and a wood frame church was erected - very modern for the location and times! Early residents said this was the highest point in Franklin

County, an auspicious place for their humble church.

The church had three windows on each side, stone steps leading to double doors, with walnut furnishings inside. The interior was tall enough to allow a small balcony. But the settlement was scattered and it never had a large enough attendance to hire a full time pastor. So a circuit-riding minister served the congregation. Strawberry and ice cream socials were held here and Sunday school was held in the non-winter months. A driveway ran between the cemetery and the church.

In 1915, after nearly 70 years as the social and spiritual center of the community surrounding what is now Muirfield, the church was either intentionally razed or accidentally burned down; reports vary, and the church was never rebuilt. The stones from the foundation were carted away to build "Leonard Tuller's House" on Brand Rd., near the entrance to Bristol Commons.

Muirfield was also home to a school. The Glick School, also called the Glick Scioto School, or the Reibel School, was sonamed for the farm on which it was located. This one-room frame building was on the north side of Glick, approximately where our Glick pool is Kids walked, rode a horse, or were transported by a 2-horse wagon with a bench on each side and a rolled curtain to keep out the elements iwhen needed. Bigger horses were used in muddy weather! Records are sparse, but it may have been built about 1871. [Anyone with more information, please e-mail Bob Fathman, rfathman@columbus.rr.com].


THE FREAKY FAST FINS OF MUIRFIELD VILLAGE ARE BACK!

receive payment of \$48,000 per acre, partially offsetting purchase costs.

The number of homes proposed dropped to 285. Approximately 300 residents turned out at the first Planning and Zoning hearing wearing "Keep Riviera Green" stickers. However, the park and wetlands proposals could not go forward if the developer continued to have a proposal before the City. Neither the City nor the Schools seemed interested in creating parks. With the inevitability of homes, RCG turned its focus to making the subdivision the best it could be, with the fewest homes.

P & Z Commissioners gave Ruma feedback that major changes were necessary and he returned a few months later asking for 244 lots. Again he was turned down, told to rework the plan to save more trees, and use "conservation design" principals.

Returning to P & Z March 26th, Ruma had dramatically improved his proposal. The number of lots was down to 185, the design had improved to create 50% open space, buffers

to adjacent neighborhoods were added, and a mile of bike paths. The RCG, City Planning staff, and P & Z Commission all praised the new plan, but felt it still needed more tweaking. Concrete or paver drives were added as a must, vinyl windows and trim were removed, and it was recommended that a few lots be removed. The next, and likely final, hearing will be past the publication date for this newsletter, but the outcome should include even more improvements.

This overview is intended to point out the truly wonderful outcome of citizens in nine civic associations working together with Planning staff, Commission members, and however reluctantly the developer. The end result should be a good subdivision -- a mix of family and empty nester homes, adjacent to 76 acres of open space, with seven ponds and most landmark trees preserved. The resulting project has met most of the objections of neighboring subdivisions, while lessening the impact on Dublin schools and taxpayers. Thank you to all who attended meetings, spoke out, e-mailed city officials and offered support. It was great teamwork -- democracy and citizen involvement at its best.

SAILING OPPORTUNITIES FOR KIDS


